

Call to Order/Introductions: at 7:07 pm by Nancy Guardabascio

Attendance: Nancy Guardabascio, Michelle Giardina, Jodi McGregor, Gene Gerstner, Scott Williams and Joyce Hartless

Approval of April 18, 2016 Board Minutes: Michelle moved to approve the minutes as presented, Gene seconded, all approved.

1. Chair Reports

- a. Humanities: Nothing to Report
- b. **Performing Arts:** We have scheduled three significant performing arts events for next season: pianist, classical guitarist and Flamenco group. Our budget will be larger than usual. But we have the funds available and feel each are important: they meet our programing criteria; and they align with our mission. In addition, Schearer will be coming back in August for guitar instruction.
- c. Visual Arts: Z-Arts sponsored the Rockville Bridge Art Exhibition. The show exceeded Jodi's expectations: 34 artists from 5 states with 54 pieces displayed, and approximately 100 people attended the artist reception. The Town of Rockville's Fundraising Committee planned this show as a community fundraiser, which conflicted with the CCC sales policy. Given the Arts & Crafts Fair is held in the auditorium, could there be an exception made to the CCC Sales Policy if the gallery show is for a community fundraiser? It's a politically sensitive subject; it has nothing to do with non-profit status. We should have a conversation with Stan Smith and Rick Wixom. Scott offered to let unsold pieces hang at the coffee shop. Brian Passy did a spectacular article. Jodi has booked the CCC through Christmas. She's waiting to confirm the traveling arts shows before she starts booking 2017.
- **d. Film**: 2nd Wednesday of every month we will have a free film showing. By the next showing, July 13th, Scott will have decided the films for August and September. Scott is considering coordinating July's film with YAZ to find something more family appropriate. Scott will be vigilant about obtaining authorization for the films we show.
- **e. Literary:** Dr. Erika T. Wurth is lined up to arrive Thursday, June 23rd. She is Apache, Chickasaw and Cherokee. She has a doctorate. She will read from her novel and her poems, but she will also speak about the process. Gene will take her to the Paiute Tribal Council building in Cedar City on the 23rd. And she will speak in Springdale on the 24th. Then Gene will host a reception at his home following the CCC Talk. Michael McLean is contributing \$500 toward her honorarium. Michael wants Z-Arts to connect with the Utah Fall Book Festival. Gene finds Stephen Peck's "A Short Day in Hell" and "Scholar Moab" very funny reads and Stephen is a good speaker, so Gene would like to have him visit in September or October.
- **f. Staff Report:** It is taking a long time to get calendar submissions posted, so the sooner Joyce receives information on events, the better. Nancy wants the events broadcast to our membership through MailChimp as soon as the

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information is available. Dr. Wurth's talk is being advertised on the website and Facebook. It will go out on MailChimp next week. Joyce was instructed to post a "film series" for July 13th on the online calendars.

- c. Breakout Sessions:

<u>Personal Accountability</u>: Linda Galindo, author of "The 85% Solution" discussed how to deal with people in a calm manner. Everyone may tackle an issue a different way; so long as the goal is met, there is success.

<u>Social Media</u>: Only boost posts that are already performing well. Facebook is the number one social media tool. Don't get so stretched out on so many different sites that you lack depth; concentrate on doing really well on the ones you utilize.

<u>Leveraging Grants</u>: If you receive a grant, it's an organization saying they've looked at you and determined you're worthy. Do not take that lightly. Use that as leverage, telling others *"if this organization believes in me, you should too"*. And keep telling the story. It doesn't matter if you took the award years ago.

Telling Your Organization's Story: Data for Arts Organizations: Museums presented this program. Michelle's take-away was that we should be getting information from our CCC guest list and keep attendees informed of events in the hopes of garnering memberships or donations. Bobbi Wan-kier collects name, email address and zip code. This information is good for grants. We should keep a guest log at all events. Attendees are not obligated, but invited to leave name and email address. Joyce will develop a form and we'll have that available at every event.

3. Membership: Joyce will provide a list of expired members to Nancy. Nancy drafted a membership appeal letter to artists and one to individuals who are not artists. A year or so ago the Board discussed offering free memberships to park employees or people under 35 and the board did not have an interest in pursuing that. We have discussed requiring artists who participate in our Gallery to obtain a Z-Arts membership. Donors should be members: hotels, for example. How do we attract people under the age of 35? We need to collect their email addresses. Scott suggested a three-month (free) membership drive (to people under 35) and then the free offer expires. We can find these "young people" (under 35) at social centers: yoga, coffee shop, library.

Nancy made a motion that Z-Arts give free memberships to anyone under the age of 30 and anyone who's a park employee, as a year-round policy. Gene seconded. Discussion: when renewal comes up, we offer to renew the membership for free if: (a) you're still in town, (b) still under 30 and/or (c) still employed by the Park. Passed Unanimously.

Michelle moved to approve the financial report and Scott seconded. All approved.
